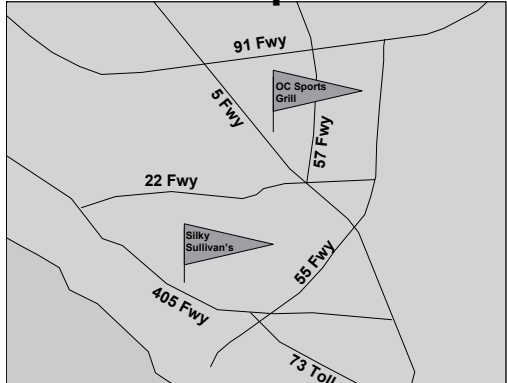


ND Football Game Watches 2010

2010 Summer Service Program

Our club successfully completed another S.S.L.P. involving six current Notre Dame students; working at four different Orange County sites. The program began on campus in November when students interested in the program were interviewed by the University Center for Social Concerns staff. They are required to attend two orientation sessions and try to meet students who were at their chosen sites the prior summer. Our alumni activity begins in April as we begin communicating with the students and site Directors to finalize their individual programs, confirming arrival dates and transportation requirements.

As in past years each student receives a \$2,300.00 scholarship, a total of \$13,800.00 of which we pay \$9,000.00. The balance of \$4,800.00 is paid by The James F. Andrews Fund from Notre Dame. In addition, the students receive three Theology credit hours for their eight weeks of summer activity with the assigned weekly readings, with written assignments. Before returning to the campus they must submit a written paper relating their summer experiences to the assigned course readings. Our club receives a copy of each of these exceptionally interesting papers. Many of you had the pleasure of meeting these outstanding, young students at our golf outing and the family picnic and student sendoff. These students were instrumental in assisting in both events and were invaluable serving on a panel answering questions from the incoming freshman. We tried to make their Orange County summer visit memorable by providing trips to Disneyland and an Angels Baseball Game. A special thank you goes to Jim Kinnane '57 for all his hard work!

Join the 2011 NDCOC Board of Directors!

Nominations are open for several positions on the 2011 ND Club of Orange County Board of Directors. Each year, the Club holds elections to replace 7 of its 21 board members, each elected to a three-year term. All nominations are due by October 15. The election will then open up and election voting continues through November 30. The votes are tallied and the new board members are announced in December.

What does a Board Member have to do? Each Board Member is required to:

- Attend monthly board meetings. Excused absences are allowed, but if attendance becomes a problem, that Board Member may be removed from the Board at the Board’s discretion.
- Pay current year’s dues and be a member in good standing.
- Chair or co-chair at least one major event during the year. This could include anything from the UND Celebration to the Golf Tournament to the Game Watches.

While we understand that this is a volunteer organization, we do expect all Board Members to participate in Club events, introduce new ideas, and help continue the strong tradition of the Notre Dame Club of Orange County as one of the most recognized and active Notre Dame clubs in the country and in the world!

How long is the commitment? Each Board Member is elected to a three-year term. In the case a Board Member must leave the Board before his or her three-year term is up, the Board can appoint a replacement for that individual to serve out the remainder of the term. When a term is over, the individual can run for election again, but only up to two consecutive elected terms. After the second term, the Board Member must take a year off before running for election again. Board terms are served according to the calendar year (January through December).



How are the Officers selected? The first meeting of the Board in January welcomes the new Board Members. Board Members interested in being the President can present their platform to the Board for a Board vote. When the President is selected by the Board, that President selects his or her officers after discussions with the Board Members interested in filling specific Officer positions.

What are the qualifications to be a Board Member? Any Club member can run for the board, including alumni, friends, and family. Each nominee must provide qualifications and some reasons why he or she would be a good addition to the board. This includes participation in past Club activities, excitement to help out in specific areas, or even just how much you love Notre Dame and want to contribute.
